In the name of God Amen I George Farley of Amelia
County being very sick and weak in body but of perfect
mind and memory thanks be given unto God calling unto
mind the mortality of my body and knowing it is appointed
for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last
Will and Testament that is to say principally and first of
all I give and recommend my Soul to God that gave it,
and as for my body I recommend it to the Earth to be buried
in decent Christian Burial and as touching such worldly
Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life
I give and dispose of the same in the following manner and
form First I will and devise that all my Just Debts be paid
all the Debt due to me to be collected and put to the best
use to do the same and what is lacking to be raised out of
my Estate by my Executors hereafter named I will and
bequeath to Mary Farley my beloved Wife four Negroes viz
Fred, Malachy, Tom and Lucy all my Stock of Horses, cattle
Hogs Sheep &c all my household goods and Furniture &c to her
and her heirs for ever I also lend her my Negro Boy named
Billy during the term of Twenty Years, I also lend my
Negro Girl named Gloc during the term of three years, I
lend her during her Widowhood the Land and Houses I have
now in my Possession, except part of it lying on the West side

sound mind & memory I do hereby declare that I am
conscious of the Mortality of my body & knowing that it is Ap-
pointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this
my last Will & Testament in manner & form following
I Give & Lend to my beloved Wife Mary Wells the peace of Land
Shad of M^r Richard Booker my Negro Girl Mary & all my
Estate during her Widowhood & After her Widowhood I
and bequeath the Aforesaid estate to my beloved son Michael
Wells & his Heirs forever, but if the said Michael Wells should
Die in his minority then I give & bequeath the said Land, Negro
and Estate to my beloved Wife Mary Wells & her heirs for-
ever, and I do Appoint my loving Brother Michel Wells &
Benjamin Casley my sole & true Executors of this my last Will
And Testament hereby Revoking all other Wills heretofore
by me made in Testimony Whereof I have hereunto set
My hand & Seal this ninth day of September 1774
