In the name of God Amen I George Farley of Amelia
County being very sick and weak in body but of perfect
mind and memory thanks be given unto God calling unto
mind the mortality of my body and knowing it is appointed
for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last
Will and Testament that is to say principally and first of
all I give and recommend my Soul to God that gave it,
and as for my body I recommend it to the Earth to be buried
in decent Christian Burial and as touching such worldly
Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life
I give and dispose of the same in the following manner and
form First I will and devise that all my Just Debts be paid
all the Debt due to me to be collected and put to the best
use to do the same and what is lacking to be raised out of
my Estate by my Executors hereafter named I will and
bequeath to Mary Farley my beloved Wife four Negroes viz
Fred, Malachy, Tom and Lucy all my Stock of Horses, cattle
Hogs Sheep &c all my household goods and Furniture &c to her
and her heirs for ever I also lend her my Negro Boy named
Billy during the term of Twenty Years, I also lend my
Negro Girl named Gloc during the term of three years, I
lend her during her Widowhood the Land and Houses I have
now in my Possession, except part of it lying on the West side

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of Sheatham Branch by name I lend to my
Mother Mary Farley during her life all the Land on the
West side of Sheatham Branch (before excepted) I give and
bequeath to my Brother John James Farley after my Wife
Mary Farley's Widowhood all the Land and Houses I lent
her during that time and after my Mother Mary Farley's
decease I give him the part I lent her during her life
to him and his heirs for ever I lend to my Sister Martha Wade
Wife of Andrew Wade after the expiration of Twenty Years
the above mentioned Negro Boy Billy (whom I lent to my
Wife that term) during her life and after her decease
I give the said Boy to her eldest Son and his heirs for ever
I lend unto John James Farley the above mentioned Negro
Girl Gloc after the expiration of three Years till his three
eldest Children comes of Age and then I give the said Girl
and her increase to be equally divided among his three
eldest Children, my Will and desire is that my Executors
raise Ten Pounds out of my Estate for the Education of
George Farley Scott I likewise constitute and appoint my
Wife Mary Farley Executrix and William Frost, Craddock
and Francis Anderson Executors jointly with her and I do
hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul all and every
other former Testaments, Wills, Bequests and Executors
by me in any ways before named made and bequeathed
ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last
Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and Seal this Twenty day of August in the
Year of our Lord Christ One thousand seven hundred and
twenty one.
