last Will and Testament in the following manner and
form first and principally I recommend my Soul to God
who gave it hoping through the merits of my blessed
Saviour to obtain full and perfect remission of my sins
and my body I commit to the ground from whence it was
taken nothing doubting to receive the same again at the
resurrection by the mighty Power of God and as for
such Worldly Estate it hath pleased God to bless me -
in this life I give and dispose of as followeth -
I hereby give and bequeath to my loving Wife Mary
Vaughan three Creggs such as she shall think proper
to chose out of my Estate I likewise lend to my loving Wife
Mary Vaughan all my Estate during life Item I give
to my Grandson Samuel Vaughan and to his heirs for
ever One hundred and eighty Acres of Land being the
uppermost Part of the Tract whereon I now dwell -
I likewise give to my said Grandson Samuel Vaughan
an equal Part of my Personal Estate with my Children
hereafter named Item I give to my Son George Vaughan
and to his heirs forever One hundred Acres of Land joining
the aforesaid Part given to Samuel Vaughan I likewise give
to my Son George Vaughan and his heirs forever an equal
Part of my Personal Estate with my other Children hereafter
named Item I give to my Son Benjamin Vaughan
One

One hundred Acres of Land being the lowermost part of
the Tract whereon I now dwell with an equal Part of
my personal Estate with my other Children hereafter named
Item I give to my Daughter Susannah Morris Five Pounds
Current Money of Virginia and I give her no other part of
my Estate Item I give the remainder of my Estate to be
equally divided between my Grandson Samuel Vaughan
and my Son and Daughter hereafter named William -
Vaughan David Vaughan Elizabeth Thacker Mary Haines
and Sarah Bagget and their heirs forever likewise my
Will and desire is that my Hanover Land and all my
Personal Estate be sold by my Executors hereafter named
and the money so arising be equally divided between my
said Grandson Samuel Vaughan and my Son William
Vaughan David Vaughan Elizabeth Thacker Mary
Haines and Sarah Bagget I likewise constitute and
