In the name of God Amen I John Scott of
 Ameliasburt do make my last Will and Testament in
 manner and form following, to wit, my Will is that my
 Estate Real and Personall shall remain in my Executors
 hands during the minority of my son Joseph to enable
 them to discharge my Just Debts & to maintain my
 Wife and Children also to educate and bring up my
 Children my Will is that my Executor may at any time
 sell any part of my Personall Estate and lay out the
 Money arising from such sales as also the profits of
 my Estate in purchasing Slaves if they shall think it to
 be advantageous to my Estate I will that my Wife shall
 during his widowhood live in the house I now live in
 and shall have a plain gentle maintainace during her
 said widowhood and if she should Marry I then give
 her Ten Pounds p^r Year during her natural life all
 which I give her in full compensation of her Right of
 Dower I give to my son John all that tract of Land

of Land which shall lay to the Westward of a line to be run
from John Tabbs (formerly Bustoms Corner) near the horse
Branch to Robert Jones Estate Corner near my cartway to
Jencks Road to him and his heirs for ever but if my
Executors shall hereafter find that it will be to the advantage
of my said son if the above lands were sold and the Money
arising from such sale to be layd out in other Lands or other
Lands & Slaves then my Will is that they may sell it and
lay out the Money arising from such sale in the manner
above mentioned I give to Robert Fields and Frances his
Wife during the time they or either of them shall dwell thereon
Twenty five Acres of Land to be laid off them so as to include
the plantation wherein they now live and at the time of their
deaths severally or their moving off the said Land I give
it to my son Edward to him and his heirs for ever and I
give to my said son Edward the remainder of all that part
of my Tract of Land which shall lay to the North of a
line to be run East from Robert Jones Estate Corner
near my Cartway into Jencks Road to James Murray line
to him and his heirs for ever and my Will is that my
Executors may sell the Land Will'd to my son Edward and
lay out the Money in same manner & use as is directed
to be done with my son John, if they shall think it will
be to the advantage of my said son Edward I give to my
son Joseph all the remainder of my Land to him and his
heirs for ever My Will is that at the time my son Joseph
come to lawfull age that all my personall Estate shall
be equally divided amongst all my Children lastly I do
constitute & appoint my friends Alexander Trent George
Carlington Junr. Jacob Williamson & Edward Bap to be
Guardians to my Children & Executors of this my last Will
and Testament and I desire that my Executors may not
be obliged to give security for their due Performances
and I desire that my Executors will have my Children well
Educated and by them bound to some persons to learn
them some art Mistry or Profession so that they
may get a livelyhood In Witness whereof I the said

John Scott have with my own hand wrote this my last
Will and Testament and have hereunto set my hand
