

In the name of God Amen I Mary Vaper of Amelia County do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following Vizt I give to my son John Vaper one certain Tract or Parcel of Land lying in Amelia County lying on the gully Branch containing One hundred and eleven Acres be the same more or less and bounded by Tinney, Webster & Richard Vapers Land, to him and his heirs for ever likewise one Feather Bed and Furniture all which I give to him and his heirs for ever I give to my son George Vaper One Negro Boy named Charles & one Feather Bed & Furniture all which I give to him and his heirs for ever I give to my son William Vaper one Feather Bed & Furniture to him and his heirs for ever I give to my son Richard Vaper one Negro Wench named Moll & one Negro Boy named Sam to him and his heirs for ever I likewise give to my said Son Richard all the remainder of my Estate both Real & Personal (not already given) to him and his heirs for ever Lastly I appoint my son Richard Vaper, Executor of this my last Will and Testament and my Will and desire is that my Estate may not be Appraised & that my Executor may not be obliged to give Security for the probate of this Will and I do hereby declare this & no other to be my last Will and Testament. Revoking all other Wills by me heretofore made either by word of mouth or writing As Witness my hand and seal this Twenty ninth day of August Anno Dom One thousand seven hundred and seventy one

Increase to him and his heirs forever Viz Winney & Sarah
after the death of his Mother I also give him a Feather Bed
with all the Furniture belonging to it I give and bequeath
to my loving son Joseph Hightower two Negroes and their
Increase Viz Abba and James to him and his heirs forever
Item I give and bequeath to my loving son Rob.^d Hightower
two Negroes and their Increase Viz Simon and Judah

and lastly I constitute and appoint my beloved Wife
my brother Charles Greenhaw my friends John Austin
and William Brittain Ex^{rs} of this my last Will and
Testament revoking all former or other Wills heretofore
by me made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and affixed my seal this Nineteenth day of
September in the Year of our Lord Christ One thousand seven
hundred and seventy one.
