Amelia County on Flatt Creek being Weak of body but of Perfect  
Sound Memory Thanks be to God for it and Considering the Morta-  
-lity of my body and knowing that it is Appointed for all men  
Once to die do make and Ordain this my last Will & Testament  
in manner and form following (Viz) First & Principally  
I recommend my Soul to God who gave it and my body to be  
Buried in a decent Christian like manner and as touching  
Such Worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with  
After all my Just debts paid I give devise and dispose of in -  
Manner and form Following (Viz) I give and bequeath to my  
son John Bartholomew Dupree thirty Pounds Current money  
to be paid to him out of the profits of my Estate as soon as it  
can be raised, I give and bequeath to my son Peter Dupree  
one Negro Girl called Fanny to him & his heirs forever -  
I give and bequeath to my son James Dupree half the Tract  
of Land which I am now Possessed with, I desire he may have  
it at the lower end Joining the Lands of Abraham Dorrest and  
Josiah Fundley I also give to my son James Dupree one Negro  
Man called Dick to him and his heirs forever, I desire that the  
two Negroes (viz) Agge and Ice with the Increase of their bodies  
that shall be after this date may be kept in the care of my Execu-  
-tors and the Profits of the said Negroes to be dispose of to my daugh-  
-ter Ann Jackson as my Executors shall think proper & at the  
decease of my Daughter Ann Jackson I desire they may be Equally  
Divided between all her Children which I give to them & their heirs  
Forever, I lend to my Daughter Martha Jackson one Negro boy  
called Ned and one negro girl called Fanny with the increase  
Of her body that shall be after this date, which slaves I desire  
she my daughter Martha Jackson and her husband may have  
the use off during their Natural lives and at their decease to  
be Equally Divided between all her Children; I give and  
Bequeath to my five grand Children (viz) Elijah Fundley  
Anthony Fundley, Charles Fundley, Ann Fundley, Elizabeth  
Fundley, the Sum of Eighty pounds Current money to be Equally  
Divided between them as they arrive to lawful Age or Married  
Provided that my Afor-said grand Children do forgo their

might be an negro woman called Jane which slave is now in the  
 possession of my son James Duprey but in case any of my  
 above mentioned Grand Children, should die without their  
 of their body I desire that what I leave them may be Equally  
 Divided amongst all the Survivors, I lend to my Wife Judith  
 Duprey my Plantation on which I now dwell on with half  
 the Land I hold joining the said Plantation during her  
 Natural life and after her decease I desire it may return  
 to my son John Bartholomew Duprey and his Heirs forever  
 I also lend my Wife Judith Duprey three Negroes (viz) Tom  
 Joe, and Hannah during her Natural life and at her decease  
 I desire it may return as follows (viz) Negro Tom to my son  
 John Bartholomew Duprey and his Heirs forever and the  
 other two Negroes, Joe and Hannah, I desire may be in the care  
 of my Executors for the maintainance of my Daughter Judith  
 Duprey during her Natural life also Twenty pounds (current)  
 Money A feather bed & Furniture a bow & all which I  
 desire may be in the care of my Executors to be disposed off by  
 them to my Daughter Judith Duprey as they shall think proper  
 during her Natural life and at her decease I desire it may  
 all be Equally Divided between all her Children lawfully  
 Begotten of her body and in case she should die without law-  
 ful heir of her body I desire it may return to my three sons  
 and their Heirs forever, I also lend to my Wife Judith Duprey  
 all my Stock and household Furniture during her Natural life  
 and after her decease my Just debts and Legacies paid what is left  
 of the Stock & household stuff I desire it may be Equally divided  
 Between all my Children also I desire that all my Negroes may  
 continue in the care of my Executors till my Legacies are all  
 Raised, my Will further is that there be no Appraisment of my  
 Estate by Order of Court and lastly I Appoint my sons John  
 Bartholomew Duprey, Peter Duprey & James Duprey my  
 whole and sole Executors of this my last Will, and Testament  
 hereby revoking, disannulling making Void all other Wills  
 by me made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand  
 and Seal this twenty ninth day of June in the Year of our Lord

At a Court held for Amelia County the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of September 1777  
This the last will and testament of Peter Dupuy deceased was exhibi-  
ted into Court and proved by the oaths of two of the witnesses thereto  
subscribed and was ordered to be recorded: And on the motion of  
Peter Dupuy and James Dupuy two of the executors therein named  
who made oath ~~that~~ <sup>and</sup> together with Barthelemy Bough and Bartho-  
lomew Dupuy their securities sworn into and acknowledged their bond  
in the Shewty of \$3000 conditioned according to Law, certificate  
is givened this for a County Record of the said will in due form.

And it was her last will for said County the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of June 1777  
On the motion of Dupuy attorney for the said Executors that the said will  
of Peter Dupuy be not a valid will as alleged by the said Executors it  
being proved to the Court by the said Barthelemy Bough and Bartho-  
lomew Dupuy their securities sworn into and acknowledged their bond  
in the Shewty of \$3000 conditioned according to Law, certificate  
is givened this for a County Record of the said will in due form.  
Know all men by these Presents that the said Peter Dupuy James  
Dupuy Barthelemy Bough and Bartholomew Dupuy are held and firmly  
bound to Edmund Rucker, Peter R. Bland & Peter Lamkin and  
Thomas & Humphord Gentlemen Justices of Court of Amelia County  
Now sitting in the Sum of three thousand Pounds to the payment  
Whereof, well and Truly to be made to the said Justices and  
their Successors we bind ourselves, and each of us, our and each  
of our heirs Executors, and Administrators, jointly and severally  
by firmly by these presents sealed with our Seals this 23<sup>rd</sup> day  
of September in the Year of our Lord one thousand & Seven hun-  
dred and Seventy seven

The Condition of this Obligation is such that if the above  
bound Peter Dupuy and James Dupuy Executors of Peter Dupuy  
Deceased, do make or Cause to be made a true and Perfect  
Inventory of all and Singular the goods, Chattle & Credits  
of the said Deceased which have or shall come to the hands  
Possession or Knowledge, of them the said Peter & James  
or into the hands and Possession of any other person or  
Persons for them the said Peter & James and the same do exhibit  
or Cause to be exhibited into the County Court of Amelia  
County at such time as to them shall be thereunto required
