Brother John Booker & Tom Branch Willson, I desire they should have
my deceased Husband with Hardaways and my Graves walled in with
brick, I also desire my Estate may not be appraised
Lastly I constitute and appoint John Booker Sen^r & Tom Branch Willson
Executors of this my Will In witness whereof Thereunto set my hand &
affix my Seal this 10th day of September one thousand Seven hundred &
Seventy eight
