County being in a low & lingering State of Health but of sound dispo-
-sing mind and memory thank be to Almighty God for the same
and calling to mind the certainty of Death and the Uncertainty of life
I do make Constitute & Appoint this to be my last Will and Testament
humbly giving my Soul to Almighty God that gave it me, & my
body to be buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named
and as for such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with
in this life I give and bequeath in manner & form following

First I give and bequeath to my daughter Pheby Mays one Negro
Wench named Jean, and her Increase to her & her heirs & assigns for
ever I give and bequeath to my daughter Linn Johnson one ne-
-gro Wench named Biddy one bed & furniture & two Cows to her
and her heirs & assigns for ever the bed & furniture being in her
Possession

I then give and bequeath to my son Willis Vaughan my Negro woman
Moll and her Child named Beck a bed and furniture my Colt &
Philly to him his heirs and assigns forever

I then I land to my beloved wife Martha Vaughan the land and
Plantation whereon I now live a negro Wench named Dinah my
Maid named Coll & all my Stock of Cattle, sheep and hogs & all the
remaining part of my household furniture and all my Plantation
Utenils during her Natural life and at her decease I give the
same to my afore said son Willis Vaughan to him his heirs & assigns
Forever I desire there may be no appraisment of my Estate

I then I give and bequeath to my son James Vaughan all that part
of my Land west of the Meeting house path that leads from flat creek
to the Old Road to him his heirs and assigns forever

Lastly I do constitute and Appoint my son Willis Vaughan -
Executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby Revoking all wills
by me heretofore made as witness my hand & Seal this 10 day of
August 1777
