thence down the road to a corner White Oak thence north thirty
Five Degrees, West seven Chains & thirteen Links; & thence
South Sixty one Degrees West to Beginning which includes
her one third of the said Lands

of body but of Perfect mind and memory do make & Ordain
this my last Will & Testament in manner and form follow-
ing first I recommend my Soul to God who first gave it me
and my body to be buried at the discretion of my Executors
and as touching my Worldly goods which has been please
God to bless me with I give and bequeath in manner
and form Following, ... Item I give unto my beloved
Wife and to my Mother the Land that I bought of John
Case during their life as also I give unto my beloved
Wife two Negroes Aneca and Phillis and all my Stock and
Household Furniture during her life

I then Give unto beloved daughter Ann Waller one
 Hundred acres of the Land at the lower End of the Tract of
 Land bought of the said John Case during her life and
 her Husband then I give and bequeath it to her son Robt.
 Clark Waller with him his heirs & assigns forever
 I then Give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter
 Archer Clark one Negro Girl named Suckey, to her & her
 heirs forever, as also one bed and furniture
 I then Give and bequeath unto my beloved son William
 Clark, two hundred acres of Land with the Plantation
 that I left his Mother it being part of the same Tract as
 also one hundred pounds current money of Virginia one
 Bed and Furniture one horse & all to him & his heirs forever
 I then Give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Mary
 Clark one Negro Girl named Amey, as also one bed and
 Furniture to her and her heirs forever
 I then Give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Martha
 Clark the first Child that fills bares as also one bed &
 Furniture, I then Give unto my beloved daughter
 Elizabeth the second Child that fills bares as also one
 Bed and Furniture to her and her heirs forever
 I then my Will and desire is that after my Wifes death the
 Negroes I left her now equally divided with their Increase
 betwixt my five youngest Children, and the stock amongst
 the the whole of them
 I then I leave my beloved Wife, John Calco & John Waller
 Executors of this my last Will & Testament in witness
 Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and fixed my seal
 this twentieth day of July one thousand seven hundred &
 Seventy Seven
