 of the same in the following Manner & form it is my Will & desire
 that my said Estate, except one Negro Fellow named Will I give
 to my Grand Daughter my wife Anne D. called Mary Johnson but
 it is my Will and desire that my Grand Daughter Mary Johnson
 may have the Use of the said Negro Will as long as she lives, & at
 the death of my Estate be divided & Divided between my live
 Children, Mary Edwards John Wright William Wright Elizabeth
 Pollard and Thomas Wright in the following Manner
 it is my Will and desire that my Daughter Mary Edwards shall
 have twenty pounds current money of my Estate less than my son
 John Wright and my Daughter Elizabeth Pollard & my son
 Wright Also it is my Will & desire that my son William Wright
 shall have eighty three pounds current money less than my son
 John Wright and my Daughter Elizabeth Pollard and my son
 Thomas Wright also it is my Will & desire that my son in Law
 Thomas Pollard may have all the Woodland Ground of the Land
 I live upon that lies between the Path that goes down the ridge to
 my son John's Plantation & the line of the Land that I gave him
 And from Where that path strikes Out of the great Ridge path to
 the Head of a valley and down the Valley to the line between I
 and Legon, and all the rest of the said Tract I give to my son
 John Wright and the Land that I bought of Thomas Elmore I give
 to my son William Wright, & I do hereby nominate constitute
 and Appoint my son John Wright & my son in Law Mr. Pollard

Executors of this my Last Will and Testament hereby revoking & disannulling all former Wills Gifts or bequests by me hereby made In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Affix my Seal the date & year first above written Signed Sealed published pronounced and Declared by the said Thomas Wright as & for his last Will and Testament in the presence of us whose Names are
