 Hastings and her heirs forever Item 2^{do} I give and bequeath
 to Betsey Hastings my Negro Girl named Hannah, Negro
 Boy named Lewis & Negro Boy Seedy to her the said Betsey
 Hastings and her heirs forever Item 3^{do} I give and bequeath
 to John Archer (son of my Sister Mary) one Negro Boy
 named Sam to him the said Archer and his heirs
 forever and as to my Goods and Chattels it is my desire
 that they should be sold to the highest bidder and
 the money converted to the use of my Creditors and the
 residue if any I give to the above mentioned John Archer

and it is my desire that my Estate may not be apprais'd
and lastly I constitute and appoint William Hastings,
and John Archer to be sole and sole Exec'ts. of this my last
Will and Testament and I do hereby make void and
disannul any Will or Wills heretofore by me made and do
acknowledge this to be my last Will and Testament & witness

 ever One hundred and eighty acres of land being the
 uppermost part of the Tract whereon I now dwelle -
 I likewise give to my said Grandson Samuel Vaughan
 an equal part of my personal Estate with my children
 hereafter named Item I give to my son George Vaughan
 and to his heirs forever One hundred acres of land joining
 the aforesaid part given to Samuel Vaughan I likewise give
 to my son George Vaughan and his heirs forever an equal
 part of my personal Estate with my other children hereafter
 named Item I give to my son Benjamin Vaughan
