In the name of God Amen I William Marshall
of Raleigh Parish and County of Amelia being in a
reasonable state of health & of sound disposing mind &
memory do make and ordain this my last Will and
Testament in the following manner Viz
My will and desire is that all my Just Debts be first
Paid I lend to my loving wife Judith Marshall during
her natural life in widowhood the use of the Plantation
whereon I now live with all the Houses & Orchards
thereunto belonging I also lend to my said Wife during
her natural life one Negro Man named Harry one named
Peter & one Negro Woman named Annaca One Negro
boy named Isaac till my Grand daughter Elizabeth
Marshall shall arrive at the age of sixteen years
or is married Also my Will is that my Negro boys
Moses & Aaron do remain with my Wife till they

arrive at the full age of Twelve Years I also lend
 my said Wife during her natural life two of my Horses
 such as she shall chuse & the fole that was foaled this
 spring half my Stock of Cattle & Hogs two Featherbeds
 & Furniture (one of which she is to have only during her
 Widowhood) and half my other household goods Further
 my Will is that Annaca shall at no rate be put under
 an Overseer I give to my Son William Marshall the
 Tract or parcel of Land whereon he now lives &
 containing Four hundred Acres be the same more or
 less also my Tract of Land in Bedford County
 call'd Whipping-Creek one Negro Woman named
 Hannah one named Phillis one negro boy Jamie
 & further after the Death of my Daughter Elizateth
 Marshall I give to my said Son William two Negro
 Men named Cled & Dick all which I give to him
 and his heirs for ever I give to my Grandson Daniel
 Marshall one Negro Girl named Etta to him and his
 heirs for ever I give to my Grand daughter Michal
 Marshall one Negro boy named Will to her and her
 heirs for ever I give to my Grandson William Marshall
 son of Robert that part of the Land whereon I now
 live lying on the South East side of my Spring Branch
 beginning at the mouth of the Branch where it runs
 into the creek thence up the said Branch to Joseph
 Osbournes line suposed to contain Two hundred Acres
 more or less to him and his heirs for ever also I give
 to my said Grand William one Negro Girl named
 Patty to him and his heirs for ever I give to my Grand
 Son John Marshall son Robert one Negro boy named
 Cesar to him and his heirs for ever I give to my Grand
 Son Robert Marshall son of Robert one Negro boy
 named Aaron which is left in possession of my Wife
 till he shall arrive at twelve Years of Age Also after
 the death of my Wife I give my said Grandson Robert
 one Negro Man named Harry both which Negroes I
 give to him and his heirs forever

I give to my Grand son Abraham Marshall one Negro
Man named Peter after the death of my Wife to him and
his heirs forever I give to my Grand daughter Elizabeth
Marshall one Negro Boy named Isaac to be delivered her
when she arrives at the Age of sixteen Years or is married
also one Featherbed & Furniture at the death or marriage of
my Wife And my Will and desire is that if my said Grand
Daughter Elizabeth dies before she arrives at the age of
sixteen Years then the said Negro Isaac shall be given
to my Grand daughter Susith Crowder to her and her heirs
forever I give to my Grand daughter Patty Marshall
one Negro Girl named Britta & one Negro Boy named Moses
to her and her heirs forever, but in case she should die
without lawful Heirs of her body then my Will is that
the Negro Girl Britta be the sole Property of my
Daughter Ann Crowder and her heirs forever & the boy
Moses be the Property of my Grand daughter Susith
Crowder and her heirs forever I give to my son in law
William Crowder one Negro man named Dick one Woman
named Lucy one boy Jack one boy Tom and one Girl
named Doll to him and his heirs forever Also after the
death of my Wife I give to my said Son William Crowder
all the Land & Plantation whereon I now live except
that Part already given away also one Negro Woman
named Annacia all which I give to him and his heirs
forever I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Marshall
one Horn and Saddle one Featherbed & Furniture to
her and her heirs forever also I leave in the care of my
Executors for the Maintainance of my said Daughter
two Negroes viz Ned & Dick they allowing & paying
her the sum of Twelve Pounds yearly during her life
and not confine her to live at any place against her
inclination After the death of my Wife I desire
her Part of Stocks & Household Furniture may be
divided amongst such of my Grand children as my
Executors shall think proper All the remaining Part of
my Estate not before mentioned I leave to be disposed of

at the discretion of my Executors after satisfying themselves for their trouble And my desire is that my Estate may not be Appraised Lastly I constitute & appoint my son William Manshall & my Son in law William Crowder Executors of this my last Will & Testament and desire they may not be obliged to give security for the Probate thereof And further my Will and desire is that my son William may not be concerned with any thing of my Wifes affairs or any thing I have left her during her life And I do hereby revoke & disannul all former Will, by made either by writing or word of Mouth Ratifying & confirming this and no other to be my last Will & Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this Eleventh day of April One thousand seven hundred and seventy one
