 Hudson, Obadiah Hudson, Elizabeth Hudson and Susanna Shelton  
 my sons & daughters one shilling Sterling each of them & no more of my  
 Estate, I here give unto my son Peter Hudson one Negro man named  
 Guy and all the rest of my Living to him & his heirs forever - -  
 I here do Appoint my Loving Son Peter Hudson sole Executor of  
 this my Last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have here  
 unto set my hand & affixed my Seal this thirteenth day of March

 Amelia being of sound mind though weak in body, and knowing the Instability  
 of all human Affairs and the Uncertainty of the life of man do constitute and  
 make this my last Will & Testament this 6<sup>th</sup> day of April A.D. 1780  
 Injunctive it is my Will & Desire that all my Just debts be first paid  
 and that as soon after my death as my Executors may think expedient  
 all the Tobacco I may have on hand be exposed to Sale together with a  
 bay mare call'd Kitty, a little Gray mare, a Sorrel horse Colt, a black  
 Horse Colt, call'd Wilkes, and a bay Colt call'd Salem, and likewise  
 all the Cattle which may be on the plantation except twenty which  
 my beloved Wife Judith may Choose and that the Money arising from
