perfect Memory Do this ²² day of October in
the year of our Lord Christ One thousand seven
hundred & Eighty two make & publish my
last Will & Testament in manner and form
following To wit First I give & devise to my
son John Clay Junior & his heirs for ever all
that piece or parcel of land which he sold
to David Craven containing one hundred &
fifty acres joining to my own lands on Deep
 Creek, Also give to my said son & to his heirs
all those Negro Slaves Stock of cattle Horses hogs
Sheep & Household furniture which I have al-
ready given him possession of & also give him
Five pounds specie to be raised out of my Estate
as soon as it can conveniently be paid

Also I give & bequeath to my Daughter
Amy Clements & to her heirs for ever the two
Negro Slaves & all their Increase also the Stock
of Cattle & Household furniture which I some
years ago gave her the possession of also give
her Ten pounds specie to be paid out of my
Estate as soon as it can conveniently be raised

Also I give to my beloved Wife Sarah
Clay the tract of land & plantation Ademond I
now live containing two hundred & fifty acres
joining to the lands which my son John has agreed

to sell to Daniel Brandy his son and
Profits & Advantages therefrom to arise to be
held & enjoyed by her for & during her Natural
Life I also lend unto my said Wife during her
Life the following Negro Slaves, to wit, George
James, Ben, Bett, Rachel, Miles, Peggy, Moll
Jesse & Effie & all my Stock of Horses, Neat
Cattle, Sheep & Hogs, & all other of my Estate
be it of whatsoever Nature or Kind I have &
lend unto my said wife for & during her Natural
Life, And upon the Death of my said wife
I give devise & bequeath all the Lands Slaves
Stock Household & Kitchen Furniture & all my other
Estate so as aforesaid Lent unto my wife During
Life unto my beloved Daughters Sarah, Martha
Dorothy, & Phoebe to them & their Heirs for ever Equally
to be divided Amongst them And if either or
any of my said Daughters shall depart this
life before Marriage then & in that case her or
their part or parts so dying unmarried shall be
Equally divided Amongst the survivors & their
heirs as aforesaid

And lastly I appoint my Friend Peter Jones
and The Griffin Peally Executors of this my Last
Will & Testament In witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal
