In the Name of God Amen I John  
Linsford of Amelia County being in sound  
mind and memory Thanks be to God for it but  
calling to mind the Certainty of Death and the  
uncertainty of this life do make and ordain this  
to be my last will and Testament in manner  
and form as followeth That is to say First  
and principally I recommend my Soul to  
Almighty God that gave it and my Body  
to be Buried in Decent & Christian burial if  
conveniently can be done and as touching  
what Worldly Estate it has pleased

Almighty God to Bless me with, I give in mannerly  
form as followeth, that is to say First I will that  
all my just Debts be paid, and then I give them  
following Slaves, Easter, Joshua, Aga Timmy,  
Caty, Nelly, Spencer, and Sam, with all my  
House hold Goods, Stocks of Hors's, Cattle, Sheep,  
and Hogs, with my Crops of all sorts whatsoever,  
unto my loving Wife Sarah Lunsford to her and  
her heirs for ever.

I am I give to Capt. William X Bradick a Negro Girl  
named Nancy to him and his heirs forever,

I am I give to Richard Bradick a Negro Girl  
nam'd Polly to him and his heirs forever.

I am I bind to my loving Wife Sarah Lunsford  
my land whereon I now live during her life  
and after her death to Capt. William X Bradick  
To him and his heirs forever, containing Two  
Hundred and Sixty Six Acres more or less, and  
lastly I do Appoint my loving Wife Executrix  
and my Friends Richard Bradick, and William X  
Bradick Executors of this my last Will and  
Testament, In witness Whereunto I have set my  
hand and Seal, this Second day of January One thousand  
Seven Hundred and Eighty two
