her heirs for Ever.

Item I give to Capt. William X Cradick a Negro Girl
named Nancy to him and his heirs for ever,

Item I give to Richard Cradick a negro Girl
named Polly to him and his heirs for ever.

Item I bind to my loving Wife Sarah Lunsford
my land whereon I now live during her life
and after her death to Capt. William X Cradick
to him and his heirs for ever, containing Two
Hundred and Sixty Six Acres more or less. and
lastly I do Appoint my loving Wife Executrix
and my Friends Richard Cradick, and William X
Cradick. Executors of this my last Will and
Testament, In Witness Whereunto I have set my
hand and Seal, this Second day of January One thousand

Seven Hundred and Eighty two
