being sick but in my sound memory thank  
to God for the same, calling to mind the  
Mortality of my Body knowing it is appointed  
for all men once to die, making and retaining  
this my Last will and TESTAMENT in Manner  
and form following, And first I bequeath my  
soul to Almighty God that gave it, hoping  
through the Merit of my Beloved Savior to  
obtain full and Perfect Remission of my sins  
And my Body to be Buried in a Christian Manner  
as for such things as it hath, blessed God to bless  
me with I give and dispose the same in Manner  
and form following

Item, I give unto my son William Tally a part  
of my Land on the upper part running from the  
Branch to out line as a line of trees have marked  
to him and his Heirs for ever

Item I give unto my son Joseph Tally a part of Land  
Joining whereon he lives running from the long  
Branch after his Spring Branch to the out  
line to him and his Heirs for ever

Item, I give and bequeath unto my son John  
Tally one half of my Land in Denwaddie County  
to him and his Heirs for ever

Item, I give unto my son Abner Tally the remain  
der Part of my Land in Denwaddie County one  
Bed one Bushel dish and Chest to him for ever

Item, I give and bequeath unto my son Paton Tally  
the Nearender Part of my Land whereon I now  
live with one Bed and one Bushel Dish and one Chest

Item I give unto my son Daniel Tally the sum of  
ty five pounds Specie to him and his Heirs for ever.

Item, I give unto my son Lodwick Tally the sum of  
Twenty four pounds Specie, one Pewter Dish to him  
his Heirs for ever

I have unto my <sup>widowed</sup> beloved Wife the use of one Bed and  
furniture, one Table, one Chest, one Mare Name a flea  
Two Cows and Calves and two Pewter Dishes and  
six plates, three Bowls, one Basin, three head of  
Sheep, five head of Hogs, one Chair, one spinning  
Wheel and Cards one Scutch, one Iron Pott one Clay  
Turner, one side Saddle, one Box Prior to her di-  
ing Life all the remainder Part of my Estate to be  
sold to pay my just Debts and Money Expences  
for the things left to her at her death to be sold and  
equally divided between my seven Sons, to wit,  
William, Jesse, John, Lodwick, Abner, Peter  
Item, I give unto my Daughter Fanny Morgan the sum  
of five Shillings to her and her Heirs for ever

Item, I give unto my Daughter Mary Bolton the sum  
of five Shillings to her and her Heirs for ever

Appointing my two sons William Tally and Jesse  
my Executors to this my last Will

Signed sealed and delivered in presence of us this  
twenty third day of August. In witness I set my hand
