 Sound Sense and Memory Calling to mind the
 uncertainty of this life and knowing it is

Appointed for all men once to Die

I give and bequeath my Soul to almighty God who
 first giveth me my body to the earth from whence
 it came and as for the World by which almighty god of
 his goodness hath pleased to bestow on me I give and
 Bequeath in form and Manner following Vixt.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Beloved Son
 Frederick Tally one Negro fellow named Bouzar
 and one Negro boy named Ellick Item I give and
 bequeath unto my son Robert Tally one Negro fellow
 named ~~Samuel~~ and my old Negro Wench named
 Minkie Item I give and bequeath unto my

beloved Daughter Delilah Tally one Negro fellow named
Siah Stern I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Nancy
Tally one Negro named Kitt Stern I give and bequeath unto
my Daughter Martha Tally one Negro boy named Dick
Stern I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Rahab Tally
one Negro girl named anickiey Stern I give and bequeath
unto my Daughter Lizza Tally one Negro Wench
named Jinny and one Negro boy named Moses and
that the said Negroes and My Children before mentioned
to stay on the plantation where I now live untill
the aforesaid Children should come of age or Marriage
And as they should arrive to age or Marriage that all
my Stock of all kinds and household furniture be
Equally Divided between them my Son Frederick
Excepted having regard that after the first Division
being made that Child have no allotment in the next
Division and so to continue untill the whole should be
Divided and then I give and Bequeath unto my Son
Robert Tally the Tract of Land whereon I now live to
him and his Heirs forever and if any of the before
mentioned should die before they come of age or
Marriage that their part be Equally Divided between
so many of my Children as are then living my Son
Frederick Tally Excepted Therefore I Ordain This my
Last will and Testament and I Appoint my Son
Robert Tally Francis Tucker and Millinton Roach
Executors To this my Last Will and Testament In Witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this
Sixteenth day of April one Thousand Seven Hundred
and Eighty two.
