In the name of God amen I William Worsham
 of the parish of Raleigh & County of Amelia being of
 sound disposing mind & memory do make & confirm
 this to be my last Will & Testament in manner &
 form following, to wit, I give & bequeath to my
 son Peter Worsham One Correll Mare & one Bed &
 furniture to him & his heirs forever. I give and
 bequeath unto my son George Worsham my Correll
 Mare & one Bed & saddle and one Bed & furniture
 I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth
 Worsham one Feather Bed & furniture, I give unto
 my Daughter Mary Worsham one Feather Bed &
 furniture all which I give unto them & their heirs for
 ever. I lend to my wife, Phillis Worsham during
 her Natural life or Widowhood the Land I now

on with all the plantation Tools, there being
-ing also all the stock of Cattle sheep & hogs (except
one cow & calf which I give & bequeath to my
Daughter Wilmoth Foster wife of Richard Foster
of said County) Also I lend unto my said wife
during his life or Widowhood, One Bay horse
called Cooker & one gray colt And my Will
I desire is that all my Family living on the Land
now with me be maintained & supported thereout
for which purpose & in order to enable my said wife
more effectually to do the same I also lend her during
her Natural life or Widowhood the following Ne-
-grees Viz, Sam, Hall, Bristol & Fanny & after
my said Wifes decease or in case she should
Marry I give & bequeath unto my son Peter Worsham
my Negro fellow Sam, to him & his heirs for ever. And
to my son George Worsham my said Negro fellow
Hall, to him & his heirs for ever. And my Negro Wench
Named Fanny & her Increase to my two Daughters
Mary & Elizabeth to them & their heirs for ever. And
my Negro fellow Named Bristol to be equally divided
between my two sons Peter & Geo. And also that in
Case my said wife should die or Marry as aforesaid
I desire that my Land may be equally divided between
my said two sons Peter & George I also give unto my

and two cows & four sheep
Wife or in Case she should marry as aforesaid for
head of Cattle Each four head of Sheep Each & Six
head of Hogs Each to them & their heirs for ever
I also give & Bequeath unto my said two Daugh-
ters Mary & Elizabeth after the decease of my said
Wife or in Case she should marry as aforesaid
two head of Cattle Each to them & their heirs for ever
And all the rest Residue & Remainder of my Estate
not here before given after the decease of my Wife
I desire may be Equally divided between my said
two Sons & two Daughters Peter, Geo. Mary and
Elizabeth to them & their heirs for ever. And I
do hereby appoint my Friend Field Mann my
said Wife Phoebe Worsham & my said son Peter
Worsham Executors of this my Will hereby revoking
& making Void all other former Wills by me heretofore
made declaring this alone to be my last Will
& Testament. And last I desire ^{that} my Estate be not
appraised. In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand & Seal this 23 day of May 1783
