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In the Name of God Amen I Abraham Burton
being Sick ^{and weak} but of Perfect mind and Memory do make & Ordain this my
Last Will and Testament in Manner as followeth,

Item I Give to my Loving wife the Plantation I now live on During her Life
or Widowhood and after her Decease to my Son Peter Burton and his
Heirs forever.

Item I Give to my Son Abraham Burton one Negro Wench Sarah which he
hath now in his Possession and all her Increase to him and his Heirs
forever.

Item I Give to my Daughter Elizabeth Sampson one Negro Wench
Frank and all her Increase also one Cow and Calf to her and
her Heirs forever.

Item I Give to my Daughter Phebe Worsham one Negro Girl Lucy
also one Cow and Calf to her and her Heirs forever.

Item I Give to my Son Robert Burton one Negro Wench Judy also
Six head of Cattle and one Feather Bed and Furniture and one
Iron Pot to him and his Heirs forever.

Item I Give to my Son Abel Burton one Negro Boy Sam also

Bed and Furniture and Six head of Cattle and one Iron Pot

to him and his Heirs forever.

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Item I Give to my Daughter Mayson Burton one Negro Girl Amy also one
Leather Bed and Furniture and one Cow and Calf to her and her Heirs
forever. And Last of all I Do make my Dear and Loving wife and
my Son Abel Burton my whole and Sole Executors to this my Last
Will to See it fully Performed as Witness my Hand and Seal
this Thirty first Day of January 1758.

Item I Give to my Loving wife four Negroes, Jack, Mol, Jony, & Jo.
During her Life and after her Decease to be given to my four Sons
Abraham, Robert, Abel, and Peter at her Disposal and all the
rest of my Estate whatsoever I Give to my wife to her and to her
Disposal amongst my Sons.
