in the Year of our Lord 1758 I Abraham Jones of Amelia County being weak
in Body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God therefore
calling unto mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed
for all Men once to die Do make and ordain this my Last Will & Testament
that is to say principally and first shall I give and recommend my soul into
the Hands of God that gave it and for my Body I recommend it to the Earth to
be buried in a Christian-like and decent manner at the discretion of my
Executors nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive
the same again by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly
Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this Life I give devise
and dispose of the same in the following manner and form
I Impreses it is my Will and I do order that in the first place all my
just Debts and Funeral Charges be paid and satisfied Item I give and bequeath
unto my Son Thomas Jones the Plantation he now lives on together with
one hundred and three Acres of Land on Squirrel level and a Plantation
on

his Heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Henry Jones six hundred & twenty two
Acres of Land in Amelia County on the west side the Sweet-houses Creek
being the northern part of a Tract of sixteen hundred & eighty two Acres
the Bounds between him and his Brothers are as follows Beginning
on the creek a little above the Fork Branch thence West twenty two Degrees
North twenty four Poles to a Corner pine then South nine Degrees West
forty one Poles to a Corner red Oak thence West eight Degrees South nine
Poles to a Corner red Oak thence West eleven Degrees North fifty six Poles
to a Corner on the said Branch thence up the same as it meanders to a corner
Maple thence West to the back line be the same more or less with all
the appurtenances thereunto belonging to him his Heirs & assigns forever

mentioned.

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Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Henry Jones one Molatto Man

increase to him his Heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son William Jones one Molatto Man

Item the remainder of my Estate I leave to be divided among my
Daughter Margaret and my three Sons Henry William and Peter at the
discretion of my wellbeloved Wife Sarah Jones.

named Elizabeth which are children of Maria and their Increase to
her, her Heirs and assigns forever.

Item the remainder of my Estate I leave to be divided among my
Daughter Margaret and my three Sons Henry William and Peter at the
Discretion of my beloved Wife Sarah Jones.

Item I do hereby and do Will make constitute and appoint my three
Sons Thomas Jones Henry Jones and William Jones my true & lawful
Executors of this my last Will and Testament.

Further my Will is that no appraisement be made or Inventory
taken of my Estate further than at the Discretion of my Executors
and I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke and disannul all and every
other

other Testaments Wills Legacies and Executors Ratifying & confirming

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this and none other to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal the Day and Year above written.

At a Court held for Amelia County February 22^d 1759

This Will was proved by the Oaths of Thomas Morris Benjamin Nagdale and Richard Hinton the Witnesses thereto sworn to by Henry Jones one of the Executors therein named and ordered to be recorded and on the motion of the said Executor who together with Peter Jones his Security entered into and acknowledged Bond according to Law & the fee was granted him for obtaining a Probate in due form Liberty being reserved to Thomas Jones and William Jones the other Executors to join in the Probate when they shall think fit.
