 And Royley parson being at this time of a weak and low condition
 In body but of sound mind and perfect Sense & Memory blessed
 be Almighty God for the same I do make and ordain this to
 be my last will and Testament In Witness and form
 Following first I recommend my soul to Almighty God that
 gave it me hoping through the merits of my blessed Saviour
 Jesus Christ to receive full pardon for all my sins my body
 I desire may be decently buried according to my Executor
 hereafter named I shall think proper and as for the Estate
 which Almighty God hath been pleased to bless me with I give
 And Dispose of it in the following Manner
 My will and desire is that my brother William Giles give the
 Plantation and Land whereon my father John Giles now lives
 To my brother Nicholas Giles and his heirs forever but if my
 brother William should refuse to make over the said Land by
 Deed when thereunto required or Die before he doth make it over
 To my brother Nicholas or his heirs then I give to the said
 Nicholas Giles the Land and Plantation whereon Snow dwell
 to him and his heirs for ever in Lieu of the said Land but my

In body but of sound mind and perfect sense & memory blessed
be Almighty God for the same I do make and ordain this to
be my last will and Testament In. Manner and form. . .
Following first I commend my soul to Almighty God that
gave it me hoping through the merits of my blessed Saviour

I desire may be decently buried according to my Executor
Hereafter Named shall think proper and as for the Estate
which Almighty God hath been pleased to bless me with I give
And Dispose of it in the following Manner
My will and desire is that my brother William Giles give the

To my brother Nicholas Giles and his heirs forever but if my
brother William should refuse to make over the said Land by

To my brother Nicholas or his heirs then I give to the said
Nicholas Giles the Land and Plantation whereon I now dwell
to him and his heirs for ever in Lieu of the other Land but my
Desire is that if my brother William doth not refuse to comply
with my Desire in giving the said Land by Deed or will in
case of his Death that then my brother Nicholas shall not have
Any claim or Title whatsoever to the Land I now live on
I give my brother William Giles two Negroes Wm & Sam
to him and his heirs forever and further my will and desire

I the said my brother William make a deed to my brother
Nicholas or his Heirs or Gift my will in case of this
Death for the Land whereon my Father dwelt that then
I give to my brother William the Land and plantation
whereon I now dwell to him and his heirs forever.

I also Give the said William one Negro woman named
Murren after the Death of my Father with her increase;
and fifteen pounds current money to be paid by my
sister Sarah Giles to him and his heirs forever.

Item I Give to my sister Mary Alway one Negro man
named Josh one feather bed & furniture and also one
fourth part of my stock of cattle and Hogg and one Gray
Horse balled brandy and one side saddle of four pounds
Price to her and her heirs forever.

Item I Give to my sister Sarah Giles one Negro woman named
Van and her Increase one feather bed and furniture one
Horse balled Burton one bower for ride saddle of four
pounds Price one large folding table three Dishes and six
Plates and one Iron Pot and one fourth part of my
stock of cattle & Hogg to her and her heirs forever
And also one Negro boy named Squire after the
Death of my Father the paying my brother William
Giles fifteen pounds current money to her & her heirs
forever. Item I give to my God Daughter Hannah Stone
one Gold Ring to the Value of fifteen Shillings.

Item I Give to my God son Charles Lewis one Silver Saver
Walt of fifteen Shillings Price one. Item I Give to my

and fifteen pounds current money to be paid by my
sister Sarah Giles to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give to my sister, Mary May one Negro man
named Josh one feather bed & Furniture and also one
fourth part of my stock of cattle and Hogg and one Gray
Horse balled brandy and one side saddle of four pounds
price to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give to my sister Sarah Giles one Negro woman named
Jan and her Increase one feather bed and furniture one
Horse balled Burton one bow for side saddle of four
pounds price one large folding table three Dishes and two
Plates and one Iron Pot and one fourth part of my
stock of cattle & Hogg to her and her heirs forever.

And also one Negro boy named Squire after the
Death of my Father she paying my brother William
Giles fifteen pounds current money to her & her heirs
forever. Item I give to my God Daughter Hannah Stone
one Gold Ring to the Value of fifteen Shillings.

Item I give to my God son Charles Lewis one Silver Served
Hall of fifteen Shillings price one Set of Silver Shoes
& one buckles of fifteen. Item I give all the remainder
of my Estate after my Just debts are paid to my brother
William Giles and his heirs forever and my Desire is that
My Estate be not appraised and Lastly I do appoint my
Loving brother William Giles Executor of this my last
Will revoking all former or other wills heretofore by

My will is that my Grey Horse and Silver Watch be sold by my
Executor hereafter mentioned and the money arriving by such
Sale to pay to my well beloved Wife Catharine to whom I give
All the remaining part of my Estate except what is hereafter Excepted
I Give to my wife Catharine Fearson
I Give to my Friend John Booker son of the Son of Richard
Booker Deceased Two pounds current money and I do
constitute and appoint him the said John Booker Executor of
