Item I Give and Bequeath to my son Edward Booher Two hundred Acres of Land  
where I now live also I Give to my son Edward Booher Two Negroes named  
Sammy and Harry to him and his Heirs forever  
Item I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Ann Booher Two Negroes named  
Dinah, and Delphita, with their Increase, to her & her Heirs forever  
Item I Give and Bequeath to my son William Booher One Mulatto Fellow  
named Jack, to him and his Heirs forever  
Item I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Ruthie Cauder One Negroe

to be decently Buried according to the Discretion of my Executrix & Successors  
hereafter named and as for my worldly Estate I Give and Bequeath as followeth viz.

Dinah, and Delphia, with their Increase, to her & her Heirs forever . . . . .

M I Give and Bequeath to my son William Booker One Mulatto Fellow  
named Jack, to him and his Heirs forever . . . . .

M I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Rebekah Charlton One Negroe Wench  
named Paptney With her Increase, To her and her Heirs forever . . . . .

M I Give and Bequeath to my Son Edward Booker & my Daughter Ann  
Booker my Houses & Household Furniture to be equally Divided Between them  
Two, To them and their Heirs forever . . . . .

M my Will and Desire is that all the Rest of my Estate which is not already  
Mentioned may be equally Divided Between my Son Edward Booker my

I Langford Bookher and my son William Bookher to them and their  
Heirs forever.

All my Desire is that my Estate shall not be Appraised And Lastly  
I Constitute and Appoint my Loving wife Jane Bookher my Exec't  
and my Sons Edward and W<sup>m</sup> Bookers Executors of this my last

Will and Testament In witness whereunto I have set my  
hand and Seal this 10th Day of November 1757.
