and Thirty five acres of Land to her and her Heirs forever and my

Devis is if my Daughter should die before she is of age or married

That my Dear beloved wife should have all my Land to her and her

Heirs for ever; Item after my Lawfull Debts are all paid I give and

bequeath to my Dear beloved wife Anna Brower and to her heirs forever

my two Negroes Tombo and Harper my horse and every thing Else I

am worth in the world (Vizt) such as money or moneys Worth

And my ~~Dear~~ ^{whole} will is that if my wife should Die
 and my Daughter before she is Married That William Covington
 and his Heirs forever should have the same that my wife and Child was
 to have &c. And I do appoint my Dear beloved wife and my Friend
 William Covington my whole Executors of this my last will and
 Testament as Witness my hand and Seal this 5th day of January 1746
