Wife and Children namely Mary Ann Mary George and
Jemima Cabaniss my desire is that two parts of of Land I have the
in this County and are in common may be sold and my desire is
that all my Estate remain in the hands of my loving wife Yeaz
Cabaniss whilst she remains a Widow But if she marries my desire
is that my Brother Matt Cabaniss and my friend the Colonsay
take it in share each whom I appoint my Executors to this my last
Will and Testament as witness my hand and Seal
