One thousand seven hundred & forty I George Marchbanks of the Parish
of Raleigh in the County of Amelia being very sick weak in body but of
perfect mind and memory thanks be given to God. Knowing it is apposite
for all men to die Do make Ordain this my last Will and Testament
That is to say Principally and first of all I give and recommend my
Soul to Almighty God that gave it And my Body I recommend to the
Earth to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner as the
Description of my Executors. Nothing Doubting but at the General
Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of
God and as touching such worldly estate wherewithal it hath pleased
God to bless me in this life I give Advaunce & Reserve the same in the
following manner and forme of Imprimis. I leave to whom my
well beloved wife during the term of her life my Plantation and all the
Personall Estates thereto belonging my two Negro Slaves Peter & Hannah and
after her deceas my wife and herne that she have with the Negroes & equal
by Divided among my three Sons George William & Joseph. Item I give
to my younger son Joseph my Plantation with Two hundred and Seventy
acres of land to him and his heirs for ever. Item I give to my Son
George Marchbanks Two hundred & Seventy five acres of land adjoyning his
Brother Josephs before mentioned to him and his heirs for ever. Item I give
to my son William Marchbanks Two hundred & Seventy five acres of land
to be laid off adjoyning to his Brother George before mentioned to him and
his heirs for ever. Item I give to my Daughter Lucy Prester One hundred
acres of land more or less beginning at George Evans line on the branch
thence along the same line to his corner at Martha Tolbotts line thence
along the said line to his corner at Benjamin Hubbard line thence along
his line to his corner thence down a small Valley to head branch and so
concluding. Item I give to Martha One hundred acres of land adjoyning
her Brothers line and my old line. Item I give to my Daughter Ann
Marchbanks One hundred acres of land her Brothers line and my old line

Description of my Executors. Nothing doubtless but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and possessing such a worldy estate wherewith it hath pleased

God to bless me in this life I give Devote & dispose the same in the following manner and form of Imprimis. Item to dear my well beloved wife during the term of her life my Plantation and all the personal estate thereto likewise my two Negro slaves Peter & Hannah and after her decease my wife and daughter that the same with the negroes & equal by divided among my three sons George William & Joseph. Item I give to my younger son Joseph my plantation with Two hundred and Seventy five acres of land to him and his heirs for ever. Item I give to my son George Marchbanks Two hundred & Seven by five acres of land adjoining his brother Joseph before mentioned to him and his heirs for ever. Item I give to my son William Marchbanks Two hundred & Seven by five acres of land to be laid of adjoining to his brother George before mentioned to him and his heirs for ever. Item I give to my Daughter Lucy Brother One hundred acres of land more or less beginning at George Evans line on Shaw branch thence along the same line to his corner at Michael Tolbot's line thence along the said line to his corner at Benjamin Hubbard's line thence along his line to his corner thence down a small valley to his branch and so concluding. Item I give to Lydia One hundred acres of land adjoining her brothers lines and my old line. Item I give to my daughter Eliza Marchbanks One hundred acres of land adjoining likewise the aforesaid line. Here my will and desire is that after the decease of above my wellbeloved that all my personal estate be Equally divided among my three sons and four Daughters hereinbefore mentioned. And Lastly I constitute and appoint mate and ordain John Marchbanks my wellbeloved wife and William Ebbels and Richard Ebbels to be my Whole and sole Executrix and Executors of this my last will.
