

Amelia County Wills 1734-1761
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In the name of God Amen June the 6, 1752.

I Godfrey Coleman of the Parish of Haughtley in the County of Amelia being
Sick and Weak but of Sound and perfect Memory thanks be to Almighty God for
the same do hereby make and declare this my last will and Testament in manner
and form following first and principally recommending my Soul into the hands of
Almighty God that goes it hoping through the Merits of my blessed Saviour Jesus
Christ to obtain the vision of my Saviour's glory. I bequeath my body to the earth to
be decently and decently buried at the discretion of My Executors hereafter named
to a Temporal Estate I give and devise in manner and form following First
- And my debts and funeral Charges be paid.

Item I give and bequeath to my two brethren William and Peter Coleman the
two hundred and more acres of Land left to me by my Father William Coleman to be
equally divided between them to them and their Heirs for ever.

Item I give and bequeath to my Brother Peter Coleman all that part of My Estate
of whatsoever kind to him and his Heirs for ever.

I do hereby make and affirm my Brother Peter Coleman my whole and sole Executor
of this my last will and Testament to do all such things in Writings whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and seal the same as is above written.

At a Court hold for Amelia County the 20th day of October 1752.
This last will and Testament of Godfrey Coleman was produced
and read in Court on the 20th day of October 1752 and was made Oath

thereto and the same was also proved by William Deane and James Tanner two of the
Witnesses thereto who made Oath that they saw the said Godfrey Coleman and believe the
same to be genuine and publish it to be his last will and Testament and that they
believed he was in his perfect Sense & Memory when it was made and admitted to Record.
