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In the Name of God Amen I James Long of
Amelia County Vath make and ordain this to be my Last
Will and Testament in manner and following first I commend
my Soul into the hands of Almighty God hoping through
thee the meritorious Death and passion of my Lord and Saviour
Jesus Christ to receive free pardon and forgiveness of all my sins
and my Body I commit to y^e Ground to be Decently Entred
at the Discretion of my Executor hereafter named.

I promise first I do give and bequeare to William Dunvant
Juner Fifty Acres of Land Lying of y^e South side of the Beaver
pond Branch joining the Neale line Trusing up a small
Branch of y^e Beaver pond Branch and I do give and bequeare
to y^e said Dunavant one feather Bed Rug and to Blanketts
to one Table and a flying pan to a basin and a Dish to one
Seder nail and one Oak Inc to one small pott and one Large
pott To two pair of pott Hooks and as for all personable Estates
as pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me I do give and bequeare
to y^e said Dunavant and to his Heirs for ever and I do
make and ordain William Dunavant Jun^r Executor of this
my Last will and Testament in Witness my hand Seal this
26th day of December 1745.

to one Table and a frying pan To 2 Sifters and a Dish to one
Seder Trill and one Oak one to one small pott and one Large
pott To two pair of pott Hooks and as for all persionable Estates
as pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me I do give and bequeave
to y^e said Dunavant and to his Heirs for ever and I do
make and ordain William Dunavant Jun^r Executor of this
my Last will and Testament as Witness my hand Seal this
26th day of December 1745.
