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In the Name of God Amen I James Scott of Amelia County
in the Colony of Virginia being sick and weak the of for fact
three and thremore thanke be to almighty God for the varne
but calling to mind the Certainty of Death uncertainty
of life and being tis appointed for all men once to die I
Recommend my soul into the hands of almighty God that
save it me and my body to the earth to be decently buried
at the discretion of my Exors hereafter named and for
what worldly ^{goodly} estate I hath beased the almighty Goddow
me with I do give and Dispose of in manner and form
following to wit — Item I give and bequeath
to my Son Roger Scott One feather bed and furniture
on which he now lieth — Item I give and bequeath to
my Daughter Abel Scott One feather bed & furniture
on which she now lieth & One Hatchel — Item I give
& bequeath to my Daughter Mary Scott one feather bed
& furniture on which she now lieth on & One Linen sheet
Item I give and bequeath to my Son George Scott One
bed and furniture on which he now lieth & my
desire is for my said son George Scott to be bound to bond
good abide at the Direction of my said Exors — Also I desire
that the list of my estate wholly and solely made be sold
both my Household Goods & my lands One tract lying
in Lunenburg County and another in Albemarle
that my Debt Dobb be Collected in and my Debt be
paid out of the money and after my Debt is paid
I am desirous that it be equally divided to my
Daughters Abel & Mary Scott & my son George Scott
I desire that Charles Shu and my son James Scott
be & I desire that my last will be

my last will & estate I have devised the following to wit
To my son Roger Scott One feather bed and furniture
on which he now lieth — Item I give and bequeath
to my Daughter Isabel Scott One feather bed & furniture
on which she now lieth & One Kitchin — Item I give
& bequeath to my Daughter Mary Scott one feather bed
& furniture on which she now lieth & One Linen sheet
Item I give and bequeath to my son George Scott One
feather bed and furniture on which he now lieth & my
desire is for my said son George Scott to be bound to some
good trade at the Direction of my said Exors — Also I desire
that the Rest of my estate wholly and solely made be sold
both of my Household Goods & my lands One tract lying
in Lunenburg County and another in Albemarle and
that my Debt be Collected in and my just Debt
be paid out of the money and after my Debt is so paid
if any Remain that it be equally divided Between my
Daughters Isabel & Mary Scott & my son George Scott
It is my desire that Charles Shy and my son George Scott
be whole and sole Exors of this my last will & testament
reaching all other that hath been made heretofore for
me in which I have hereunto affixed my Seal & set my
hand thereunto this Twenty seventh day of December 1769
