Mind and Memory thanks be to God for the same and knowing that
that it is appointed for all men ~~once to Die~~ to make and ordain
this my Last Will and Testament that is to say principally And first of
all I give and Recommend My Soul to the hands of God that gave it
for my Body I Recommend to the Earth to be buried In a Christian like
and decent Manner at the Discretion of my Executors Nothing doubting
but at The general Resurrection I shall Receive the same again
by the mighty Power of God as touching such Worldly Estate
Wherein it hath pleased God to bless me in this Life I give and
Dispose of the same in Manner & form following Order that In
the first place all my Just Debts & Funerall Charges Be paid and
Satisfied. Then I give and Bequeath unto my three Sons John
Robert & William all my Land to be equally Divided When they
come of age John to have the Plantation Where I now dwell William
to have the old Plantation And Robert the upper part joining
Henry Jones and my Desire is that if either of my three Sons Dies
Before they arrive at the age of twenty one their part shall be
Possest By my son David if he Lives till twenty one years of age
to them their heirs and assigns
I give & Bequeath unto Thomas Booth & John Booth & my
Dearly Beloved Wife Ann Mayton twelve Pounds Current Money
to be raised levied out of my Estate to give my three sons Robert William
and John Schooling.

Item All the rest of my Estate to be equally Divided Between my three
children Mary Martha and David.

all I give and Recommend My Soul to the hands of God that govern it
for my Body I Recommend to the same to be buried In a Christian like
and Decent Manner at the Discretion of my Execution Nothing doubting
but at The general Resurrection I shall Receive the same again

Item All the rest of my Estate to be equally Divided Between my three
Children Mary Martha and David I Desire that my Estate shall not
be appraised I leave Thomas Booth John Booth and my Wife
Ann Mayton my only & sole Execution of this my last Will and
Testament I do hereby Disallow Revoke & Disannul all and every
other former Testament Wills and Legacies & Rat. By me any
ways before this Time named Willed & Bequeathed Ratifying and
Confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament In

Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal Day and Date above Written. John Mayton

At a Court held for Amelia County the 26th Day of March 1761.

This Will was proved by the Oaths of John Booth and Thomas Clay two of the Witnesses thereto sworn to by Thomas Booth one of the Executors therein named and Ordered to be recorded And On the Motion of the said Executor who entered into and Acknowledged Bond with John Booth his Security as the Law directs Certificate was granted him for obtaining a Probate in due Form Liberty being reserved to the other Exors to join in the Probate when they shall think fit.
