Sound and Disposing Memory but knowing the uncertainty of
this life and that the time of my Disolution draws nigh I make
this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form following
I give and Bequeath my soul into the hands of Almighty God
who gave it And my Body to the Earth to be Interred by my Executors,
hereafter named And as to such temporal Estate it hath pleased God
to Bless me with I Give and Dispose of the same in manner and
Form as follows:

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Son Thomas Wingo one Shilling
Sterling to him and his Heirs forever

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Son William Wingo one Shilling Sterling
to him and his Heirs forever

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Hill one Shilling Sterling
to her and her Heirs forever

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Mary Hill one Shilling Sterling
to her and her Heirs forever

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Hannah Hill one Shilling
Sterling to her and her Heirs forever

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Son James Wingo all the Real Estate
Estate of what Nature or Property whatsoever both Real and
Personal to him and his Heirs forever

Item I constitute and appoint my Son James Wingo whole and sole Executor
of this my last Will and Testament and I do hereby revoke and make void all
former Wills by me heretofore made and do declare this to be my last and true
Will in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal
this 11 Day of February 1758
