First I bequeeth my Soul in to the hands of Almighty God who gave it me And my body to the Earth from whence I was taken to be decently Entred at the discretion of my Loving and Executor here after named And as to what worldly Estate God Almighty hath been pleased in his providence to bless and intrust me withall I give and bequeath in manner and form following.

I It is my Will and desire my Loving Son George Worsham should have all my Land belonging to the both Sides on the upper side of the my branch the Tract which Dannel Jackson lives on to him and his Heirs for ever.

II I Give and bequeeth to Daniel Jackson the son of Dannel Jackson the Tract of Land which Frances Maryman lives on to him and his Heirs for ever.

III I Give and bequeeth to John Gillum Son of John Gillum Two hundred Acres of Land at the lower end of the Tract I now live on to him and his Heirs for ever And the said John Gillum I give to his Father or law Thomas Adams

IV I Give and bequeeth to John Worsham all the remainder of the tract of Land where on I now live One feather bed and furniture Two Cows and Calves Five Sows and Pigs and all the Hogs what is call'd in Devon And all the Horses and mares which he has in his possession And all my Guns and all my Coopers Tools Two pots one Dish and Iron spoons To him and his Heirs forever.

upper side of the main branch the Tract which Darnell Jackson lives
on to him and his Heirs for ever

It I give and bequeth to Daniel Jackson the son of Darnell
Jackson the Tract of Land which Frances Maryman lives on to him
and his Heirs for ever

I L I give and bequeth to John Gillum Son of John Gillum Two hundred
Acres of Land at the lower end of the Tract Snow lives on to him and
his Heirs for ever And the said John Gillum I give to his Father in
law Thomas Deans

It I give and bequeth to John Worsham all the remainder of the tract
of Land whereon I live Also One feather bed and furniture Two Cows
and Calves Five Hens and Eggs and all the Hogs which is call'd
his own And all the Horses and mares which he has in his
possession And all my Guns and all my Coopers Tools Two pots
one Dish and six spoons To him and his Heirs forever

I L I give and bequeth to my Well Beloved Wife Elizabeth A Third
part of the benefit of the mill and all the rest of the moveables of
my Estate And to be hers to give to whom she pleases

It It is my desire that Daniel Jackson may have the land of the
Spring that is on my plantation which he now makes use of to
him and his Ears forever

I Nominate and appoint my Loving Wife and my True and Only Friend
John Worham to be my whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and
Testament revoking all other Wills by me formerly made publishing
and pronouncing this to be my Will in Testament whereof I have
(this day and Year first above written) here unto set my hand and
fixed my Seal
