I have given to my second daughter Mary Gray all the Minnithams of the Land
which she has been and containing one hundred and fifty Acres of
Land and the same I have to my well beloved daughter
Mary Gray a small well settled Dwelling and to have as much and
of my Estate as will purchase her a comfortable and useful and
Acquire her an education and she may well be so well as she
have the use of all the Minnithams of my Estate during her life and
and afterwards to be sold and the Money to be paid to her
my dear daughter Mary my whole Estate of the one half and the other
to be paid to my dear daughter Mary and the same I have given to
my dear daughter Mary

A cert held for Smith County the 19th day of April 1845 Ann Gray
Relict of Joseph Gray presented the last Will and made oath she was
unmarried to the father of James and son Edward Thomas and
Alexander Gray witnesses thereto which was ordered to be recorded.
