

In the name of God, I, Lucy Clarke do hereby certify that I do make this my last will and testament in manner following, to wit: I desire that all the debts I am indebted with be paid by the will of my husband Richard Clarke deceased as that given to me by the will of my dear friend John Clarke deceased be equally divided between my two children James and Hannah.

But as I am in doubt that by the will of my husband my son James may obtain what in that will is given to me in my right may belong to me after my decease then and in such case my will and desire is that the whole which I possess in my own right and whatever I shall hereafter become due to me shall be and do hereby I give the same to my daughter Hannah to her and her heirs forever.

But if my said son James shall not dispute what is given to me by my late husband Richard Clarke then what I am possessed with shall be divided as is above mentioned between my two children.

I do constitute and appoint my brother Edward Clarke to divide my estate between my two children to which Division they shall agree.

And I also do constitute and appoint my said brother Edward Clarke to be my executor and I have this thirteenth day of August

One thousand seven hundred and fifty four set my hand and seal.
