I Moses Yearbrough of the Parish of Rottonway in the County of Henrich in Virginia being very sick and weak in Body, But of sound minde and memory thanks be given unto God. Therefore calling unto minde the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, Do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament That is to say Principally and first of all. I Give and Recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it And my Body to the Earth to be buried in Decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my Friends. nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection to receive the same again by the mighty power of God. And as touching such Worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life. I Give Demise and Dispose of the same in the following manner and form That is to say after the due payment of all my Just Debts.

I Give and Bequeath to my well beloved Sister Prescilla Yearbrough. whom I likewise constitute Make and Ordain Sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament, all and Singular my Lands Messages and Tennements. by Her freely to be Possessed and enjoyed Together with one negro Boy Named Jack also all my other Estate whatsoever or any ways to me belonging. And I do hereby utterly disallow Revoke and Disannul all and every other former Testaments. Wills Legacies and Bequests and Executors by me in any ways before Named Willed and Bequeathed Ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the Day and Year above written.
