

Page 65a. Will of Richard Ogleby of Raughley Parish and County of Amelia, being sick and weak, dated 28 Nov. 1749
To my beloved wife Mary the use of all my land dureing the time she remains my widdow. If my wife should marry then she be immediately dispossesst of all manner of right to the use of my land. To my wife the use of four of my best Negroes and after her death to my two sons John and Richard.

To my two sons John and Richard Oglebys after my wife is dispossesst, all my land to be equally divided.

To my two sons John and Richard Oglebys, all the residue of my Negroes. If my sons should die without lawfull ishue then my wife should have all the Negroes she was possesst of before our marriage.

My will is that there by no appraisment of my estate.

My wife should have all the residue of my estate.

My wife together with my friends Wm. Archer and Henry Anderson executrix and executors.
