and form following First and Principally, I recommend my Soul into
the hands of Almighty God that gave it Hoping through the Merits
of my Blessed Saviour Jesus Christ to obtain full remission of my
Sins. And my Body to the Earth to be decently buried at the
Discretion of my Executor hereafter named As to my Temporal,
Estate I Give and Dispose in manner and form following First,
I Will that my Debts and Funeral Charges shall be paid
I Give and Bequeath to Martha my Wife the Land and
Plantation whereon I now live during her Natural life. And
at Her Decease to fall to my Son Daniel to him and his Heirs ever
I also Give and Bequeath to Martha my Wife both my Negro
Joe and Dick during her life I also Give to Martha my Wife
all my Goods and Chattels during her life
I Give and Bequeath to my Son Joseph my Negro Man called
Joe after the Decease of Martha my Wife to him and his Heirs
for ever I also Give to my Son Joseph One Cow and Calf
I Give and Bequeath to my Son Daniel the Land and Plantation
whereon I now live after the Decease of Martha my Wife to him
and his Heirs for ever I also Give him my Negro Boy Dick
after the Decease of Martha my Wife to him and his Heirs for ever
I also Give him Two feather Beds and furniture as they stand
and my oval Table and two Cows and Calves and four Leather
Chairs and my black leather Trunk after the Decease of Martha
my Wife

I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Clay One featherbed
and furniture as it stands up stairs after the Decease of Martha my Wife

I Give and Bequeath to my Son Robert Two pounds three
Shillings to him and his Heirs for ever I also make my Son
Robert Whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and
Testament. And all the rest of my Personal Estate to be Equally
Divided amongst all my Children and last my Will is that
my Estate should not come to an appraisement

In the Name of God Amen I Isaac Morris Senr. being Weak of Body but in my perfect Sense and Memory praised be God Almighty for the same and knowing the Uncertainty of this mortall life I therefore make and ordain this my Last Will and Testament Revoking all other Will by me formerly made And this only to be my last Will and Testament I therefore Give and Bequeath as followeth -

I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Morris One Negro man named Bridge which she hath already in Possession and Love and Duty to her and Her Heirs and Assigns forever.

I Give and Bequeath to my Son Moses Morris One Negro Girl named Jamer and Three hundred Acres of Land lying in Amherst County at the place called Jacks Quarter taking it in a regular manner to lines that it may not be lost
