Short Musket and all the rest of my money or goods
I Likewise constitute and appoints Jordan Yarbrough
and Peter Samken Exors of this my last will and
Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and Seal this eighth day of March One thousand
Seven hundred and Sixty Nine

I give and bequeath to Archibald
Yarbrough one fiddle. I likewise give and bequeath to —
Lemuel Barnum my little gunn and my horse. I likewise
give to Jordan Yarbrough my long Musket at Williams
Greenshaws likewise all my shoe making Tools and my
Short Musket and all the rest of my money or goods.
I likewise constitute and appoint Jordan Yarbrough
and Peter Samiken Executors of this my last will and
Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and Seal this eight day of March One thousand
Seven hundred and Sixty Nine
