Remainder or Residue of the Tract I now live on It is my
will and Desire that my Exors here after named (who are -
hereby Impowered and Directed, so soon as my son Jesse shall
arrive to the age of twenty One years to lay off and divide the
above Divided Land as they shall think most Just & equitable
which said Division shall be valid and binding on my
Said son Jesse and his Brothers Charles Howell, Richard

twenty pounds current money and a Feather bed and furniture

I do Give and devise unto my Daughter Susanna
Featherstone Twenty pounds & a feather Bed and furniture —
I do Give and devise unto my six sons David, William
Gigg Featherstone Lewis Featherstone Jesse Featherstone Richard
Featherstone Purvel Featherstone & Charles ^{Ames} Featherstone & to their
heirs for ever the Remainder or Residue of my Estate of what
ever kind or nature to be equally divided amongst them —
after paying my Debts Funerall Expences and the several legacies
to my Daughters — and Lastly I do nominate &
appoint my two Sons William Gigg Featherstone & Lewis
Featherstone Executors of this my last will and Testament hereby
Revoking all former wills by me made In Witnes whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twenty
second day of August One thousand Seven hundred & Sixty
