

In the Name of God Amen I William Green of Amelia County
being of Sound and perfect memory Do make this my last
Will and Testament in manner following

Item I Give to my Son Thomas Green one Tract of Land and
Plantation call'd the Horsepen containing about Seven Hundred
and fifty Acres be the same more or less lying between the Road
commonly known by the name of Greens road and Appamatox
River to him and his Heirs for ever

I also Give to my said Son one Negro Boy named Robin

Item I Give to my Son William Green the Plantation on
which I now live containing Six Hundred and fifty two Acres
be the same more or less to him and his Heirs for ever

I also Give to my said Son William one Negro Boy named
George but my Will is that my wife Amey have the use
of this plantation excepting so much of it as lies on the

West side of Greens Road, during her containing my Widow

Item I Give to my Son Filmer Green all my Land adjoining

my Son Thomas Col: Bolling Walter Childs and Sam^e

Cobbs being about One thousand Acres to him and his Heirs

for ever I also Give my said Son Filmer one Negro Boy

named Lemmey Item I Give to my Daughter Martha

One Negro Girl named Moll and her Increase

Item I Give to my Daughter Amey One Negro Girl

only known by the name of Greens road
to him and his Heirs for ever
I give to my said Son one Negro Boy named Robin
I give to my Son William Green the Plantation on
which I now live containing Six Hundred and fifty two Acres
be the same more or less to him and his Heirs for ever
I also give to my said Son William One Negro Boy named
George but my Will is that my wife Amey have the use
of this plantation excepting so much as it lies on the
West side of Greens Road during her containing my Widow
Item I give to my Son Filmer Green all my Land adjoining
my Son Thomas Col: Bolling Walter Childs and Sam: C
Cobbs being about One thousand Acres to him and his Heirs
for ever I also give my said Son Filmer one Negro Boy
named Gemmey Item I give to my Daughter Martha
One Negro Girl named Moll and her Increase
Item I give to my Daughter Amey One Negro Girl
named Frank and her Increase I also give to my said
Daughter Amey one Negro Boy named Lewis
And Whereas my Wife is now with Child which if it
should be a Boy then I give him one Negro Girl named
Nanney and one Negro Girl named Sary and their
Increase and if either of my Sons to whom I have given

Land die before they com to full age then my Will is
 that the Land before Given to such Son or Sons Desend to
 this Boy and his heirs for ever. But if the Child my wife
 goes with be a Girl then I only Give her the two Negro Girls
 Nanney and Lang and their Increase. I Give to Samuel
 Cobbs and his heirs for ever Four Hundred Acres of Land
 on Wintercome Creek formerly patented by the said Samuel
 and now included in my Patent of Two thousand and fifty
 Acres. Item I Give to my wife Amey the use or Labour of
 two Negro men Sambo and Mingo during her Natural Life
 I likewise allow my wife the use or Labour of all my Negroes
 not before mentioned and all my personal Estate during
 her Widowhood to enable her to bring up and Educate my Children
 but at her Intermarrying Then my Will is that all my
 Negroes with their Increase excepting those two allowed
 my wife for her life be equally Divided by my Executors among
 all my Children and my other personal Estate to be by my said
 Executors equally Divided among my wife and Children
 but the Division of the Negroes not to be untill One of my Sons
 come to age. And further my will is that my Sons and
 the Negro Boys given them be bound out to learn such Trade
 as they shall choose but not before they com to the age of
 sixteen Years. Lastly I do appoint my Brother Abraham
 Green Thomas Green son of Thomas Green and Henry Clay
 Junr. Executors of this my last Will unto which I have
 this XIX day of July 1744 Set my hand and seal.

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Executors equally Divided among my wife and Children
but the Division of the Negroes not to be untill one of my Sons
come to age. And further my will is that my Sons and
the Negro Boys given them be bound out to learn such Trade
as they shall choose but not before they come to the age of
Sixteen Years. Lastly I do appoint my Brother Abraham
Green Thomas Green son of Thomas Green and Henry Clay
Jr. Executors of this my last Will unto which I have
this 22nd day of July 1747 Set my hand and seal

signed sealed published
and declared by William Green
to be his last will in presence of us

At a Court held for Amelia County of 22nd day of Aug^r 1747. This
Will of William Green was presented in Court by Abiam Green
Thomas Green & Henry Clay Executors therein named and proved by
the Oath of John Llewellyn one of the Witnesses thereto who also made Oath that he see Rich^d
Clarke the other Witness sign as such and is admitted to Record. The S^d Executors
refused to take on them the Execution of the said Will. Whereupon Amey Green Widow
of the S^d Dec^d pray^d Administrat^r of the S^d Deced^t Estate and she having made Oath to
the S^d Will and took the Oath appointed to be taken by Execut^r Certificate is granted
her for obtaining Letters of Administration with the Will annexed in due form of
Law
