Item And Bequeath to my Loving Wife Judith Fain the Plantation that now live on her life and after Her Decease to my Loving Son John Fain to him and His Heirs for ever -

Item My Will and Desire is that all the Remaining part of my Estate Cattle Horses Negro Household stuff money and all other my Estate not before mentioned To be Equal divided among my Children.

My Dear and loving Friend Charles Anderson my Witness and Sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament this 14 day of December 1749
