 God, having Engaged in the Service of my Country, and not
 knowing that it will please God that I shall return to the enjoy-
 ment of my worldly Effects, do Constitute and ordain this my
 Last Will and Testament. In premises I give and bequeath to
 my Brother John my Negro fellow Tuser to Remain his property
 untill his Son Thomas shall arrive to Lawfull age and then
 the said Negro fellow Tuser to descend to his said Son Thomas
 and to heirs forever and if his said Son Thomas should die before
 he arrive to Lawfull age then the said Negro to Remain the
 property of my said Brother John and his heirs forever, I also
 give to my said Brother John in Case I should not Return
 a Bond from Arroy Long to me amounting to Thirteen pounds
 Ten shillings, also a bond from Samuel Staples amounting to
 Seven pounds to him and his forever, I give to my Nephew
 the above said Thomas a Balance due to me from his Father
 amounting to Twenty six pounds Nine shillings and Lastly
 that the above Legacies may be disposed of according to
