known by the name of Falling River to be equally

divided between them the line to be run by my Brother John Bolling and my brother Thomas to have his Choice for them The said John & Thomas their Heirs Executors -

Administrators or Assigns forever.

I give and bequeath to my brother Robert Bolling my Plantation cald and known by the name of ^{The} Buffalo lick on the north side of James River for him and his Heirs forever as also my negroes well Joe Boister Ball Sarah and sis with the Children belonging to Sarah and sis for the said Robert Bolling and his Heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my Brother Archabald Bolling my Plantation cald and known by the name of the old Town as also my Ware Houses at the place cald Pocharuntas and my lots at Bermuda Hundred for him and his Heirs forever. I give and bequeath to my Sister Mary Bland my Negro woman Joan and all her Children except Louisa for her and her Heirs forever I give and bequeathe to my Sister Sarah Tase well one hundred pounds for her and her heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my Sister Ann Bolling my Negro girl Louisa and her Increase for her and her Heirs forever.

I give and bequeathe to my friend Richard Hidermeade my Trusty servant Jack for him and his Heirs forever. It is my Will and desire that my my Book be given up to my Brother Robert and that he receive all the debts due to me and pay all that I owe.

I give and bequeath to my Cousin Bolling Eldridge my Negro fellow Bob that is now at work with him for him and his heirs forever. the rest of my Estate Negroes Horses Cloaths and every other part of my Estate not Already given

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I give and bequeathe to my Brother Archibald Bolling
for him and his heirs forever. This is my last Will and
Testament wrought the thirteenth day of July in the
year of our Lord one Thousand seven hundred sixty nine
in my own hand Writing and as a proof Whereof
have set my hand and affixed my seal
before these Witnesses;

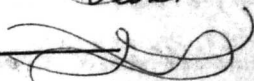

and at a Court for the said County the fifth day of November
1770 Robert Bolling Gent. personally appeared in Court
and on his motion Probate of the last Will and Testament
of Edward Bolling Dec. is granted him he having first
taken the Oath of an Executor and with William Cabell
& Edmund Wilcox his Securities entered into an
Acknowledged Bond in the penalty of five thousand
pounds with the Condition required by Law.
