 and Testament in manner and form following (viz)
 revoking and making void all Will or Wills by me formerly made
 First I recommend my Soul to almighty God in whom and by
 the merits of Jesus Christ I trust and believe to be saved &
 My body to be buried in such decent and Christian like manner
 as my Executors here after named shall think fit and as
 for my Temporal Estate and whatever else God have been
 pleased to bestow upon me I give and bequeath as follows
 I give and bequeath all my last Debts and Funeral Charges to be
 paid out of my whole Estate Item I give and bequeath to
 My Loving wife Margaret Campbell my whole plantation
 while she lives undow and in case she marries the said
 plantation shall be sold and my Wife to go off with her
 third of my Moveables, and out of the money arising out
 of the price of said plantation and my Moveable Estate
 I give and bequeath to my Daughter Catherine Twenty pounds
 Item I give and bequeath to my son John Fifteen pounds of
 the rest of the Money arising from my Estate real and
 personal to be divided equally among the rest of my
 Children (viz) Elizabeth, Archibald, George, Edley
 Thomas, Margaret, Ruth Campbell and in case
 any of the above Children named should be dead or
 entirely go off before they come of age (marriage excepted)

them such Child or children shall not receive one farthing
lastly I constitute and appoint my loving wife Margret
Campbell & Charles Patrick Executors of this my last Will &
Testament as Witness my hand and seal y^e 1st Nov^r 1776

At a Court held for Amherst County the 5th day of May 1777
This last will and Testament of George Campbell deceased was presented
in Court by Margret Campbell and Charles Patrick the Executors
therein named, whereupon the said will was proved by the Oaths
of Thomas Pannett & Charles Patrick (he the said Charles Patrick
renouncing the Executorship) which is ordered to be recorded
and on the motion of the said Margret Campbell who made
oath according to Law, Certificate is granted her for obtaining
probate thereof in due form giving Security whereupon she
with Alexander Reid Esq^r and John Henderson her securities
entred into and acknowledges bond of the penalty of £500 + 0 + 0
with the condition Required by Law and the said Margret then Open Court (being the widow & executrix of
the said George Campbell) did renounce all benefit and advan-
tage which she might claim by the said Will and demanded her thirds according
to Law &c.
