Sound memory of mind do make & Ordain this my last
Will & Testament as followeth first I give my Soul to

Earth to be buried at the discrecion of my Executors
hereafter mentioned and my Worldly goods in
the following manner. Item I give & bequeath
unto Agnes my well beloved Wife all my Real and
Personal Estate for her to keep in free & Quiet
Possession during her life and further more at the
decease of my well beloved Wife my lands may be
Tenemented out till my Younger Child shall come
to Years of Maturity and then to be sold as well as
my Goods and Chattels and all other things of my Real
and Personal Estate Likewise to be sold and the
Money of all my Real & Personal Estate such as Lands
Goods and Chattels & all other things of my Estate
the Money of all to be Equally Divided amongst my
Children lawfully begotten from my own body and
in case any of my Children die before they come to
Years of maturity or without Issue then their part
of the said Estate to be equally divided amongst the
Rest then Surviving & furthermore I appoint James
Neavel Gent. and William Martin Gunsmith
Executors, as witness my hand this Twentieth day of
July in the Year of Lord one thousand Seven hundred
and sixty Eight. Seal'd Seid and Delivered in the

This last Will & Testament of Hugh Willoughby Deceased, was presented in Court by Agnes Willabee, and proved by the Oath of Thomas Picknell and Charity Willabee two of the Witnesses thereto and Ordered to be Recorded, and on the Motion of the said Agnes Willabee the Widow & Relict of the said Decedent Administration with the Will Annexed is granted her (James Newell Gent, and William Martin, the Executors in the said Will named) personally appearing & renouncing the Executorship) she having taken the Oath according to Law & with Charles Tate & Lawrence Suddoth her Securities entered into and Acknowledged Bond in the Penalty of One Hundred & fifty Pounds withth Condition required by
