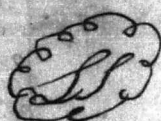


The Tenth Day of May 1770 Certificate for Administration

hundred Acres I hold on Elk Island Creek likewise the Two
hundred Acres I hold on the Creek Cold Nobbly's Creek
likewise Four hundred & Eighty Acres I hold on David's Creek
in Buckingham County Colled the Meadow likewise fifty Acres
Between the Meadow Land & where I now live likewise Three
hundred and fifty acres more or less on Buffalo River
I Turn I Give and Bequeath to the above said Robert
Williams and to his heirs forever Sixteen Negroes To be To-
Glasgo Roger will Filler Sarah Jude Jack Dublin Hannah
Hannah Two Negroes Named Joseph Hannah and Abba To whom the abo-
ve said Robert Williams I Give the above said Land and Negroes

with their Increase & to his Heirs forever. I am give
 & Bequeath to the above said Robert Williams and to
 his Heirs forever all the rest of my Estate Real and personal
 I am my will is that my estate be not Proved I nominate
 and appoint the above said Robert Williams Executor &
 Sole Heir of this my last Will and Testament I do
 acknowledge publish and Declare this the same in
 Manner and form aforesaid in witness whereof I have
 set my hand & seal in presence of
 James Thompson James Freeland.

At a Court held for Amherst County at the Courthouse
 the seventh day of May 1770.
 This last Will and Testament of James Freeland Deceased
 was presented in Court by Robert Williams the Executor
 therein named. and proved by the Oaths of James Thompson
 Mace Freeland & Fletcher Gregory three of the Witnesses
 thereto and ordered to be Recorded and on the motion of the
 said Executor who made Oath according to Law Certificate
 is granted him for Obtaining Probate thereof in due form
 giving Security whereupon he together with Joseph Catell
 Mace Freeland & William Horsley his securities entered
 into & acknowledged bond in the penalty of Three thousand
 Pound. with the Condition required by Law.
