 Day of September in the Year of our Lord God one Thousand Seven  
 hundred and sixty three I James Morrison in the County of Amherst  
 being very Sick and weak in Body but in perfect mind & memory  
 thanks be given to God therefore calling unto mind the mortality  
 of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to  
 die do make and ordain this my Last Will & Testament that is to  
 say principally and first of all I give & Recommend my soul

(37) into the hands of God that gave it and for my Body I Recom-  
mend it to the Earth to be Buried in a Christian like and  
Decent manner at the Discretion of my Executors nothing  
Doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall Receive the  
same againe by the mighty Power of God and as touching such  
Mortall Estate wherewith it hath Pleased God to Bless me with  
in this Life I give bequeath and Dispose of the same in the follow-  
ing manner and form Impromissu I give to the Heire that I  
now Expect my Wife to be with Child of the plantation with  
four hundred Acres of Land that I now possess to it and its  
heirs to be possessed when it comes to Lawfull Age, but if  
my supposed Heire above mentioned should not live to that  
Age then the said Land above mentioned to Devolve to my Wife  
and she to Enjoy the same and her Heirs forever & further  
my Will and Desier my honored father and mother that give  
me the above mentioned Land to me by Deed of Gift <sup>shall have a competent maintenance on the said Land</sup> during  
their Natural Life ~~And~~ in case I should have no heire  
by my Wife I give and bequeath to my beloved Brother Thomas  
Morrison and his heirs the Sum of <sup>Current money</sup> Thirty Pounds to be paid  
by my Wife the heire of my said Land and all other my  
Estate in form above mentioned and I Desier all my movable  
Estate my Wife and her heirs may Enjoy it forever as Witness  
my hand and Seal the Year and day above Written, (the word  
and his heires interlined before signed) and I do appoint my  
Loving Brother John Morrison and my beloved Wife Executors  
of this my Last Will & Testament

I Ambrose Lee of the County of Amherst, being  
Sick and Weak, but of perfect Sense and memory, Do  
make and Ordain this my last will and Testament  
in manner and form Following, all that tract of  
Land Lying in Amherst County, on the North side of  
Buffaloe River, Containing Eleven hundred and Se-  
venty Acres, of which four hundred Acres of which be-  
long to George Penn on that part wherein he has sea-  
ted a plantation: the remaining Seven hundred and  
Seventy Acres joining of another tract on the said side  
of Buffaloe River Containing Two hundred Acres,  
The two Tracts then containing Nine hundred and  
seventy Acres, to be divided by William Cabell Junr. &  
George Penn, in maner following: three hundred &  
seventy Acres to be laid off in a lot joining to George Penn  
Line; and the new line which joins the Great line,
