In the name of god amen I Will Campbell of Amherst County
being weak in body but of sound mind and memory do
make this my last Will in the first place I give & bequeath
unto Tabithy Balloe daughter to Leonard Balloe former-
ly of Albemarle County but now living on New river for
the great pains and care she has taken of me on many
sore diseases the six following Slaves Frank & Anne his
wife & her Child Sampson Harry and his wife Selena
& her Child Cuffy with their Increase Likewise give
and bequeath to the said Tabitha Balloe the Land which
I now live on lately purchased of James Smith Together
with my House hold and Kitchen Furniture as they now
stand. I further desire as the plank or is already gotten
that the house may be finished off in a decent plain manner
I give unto the said Tabithy Balloe all the provisions I may
have at my Death of Bacon Beef &c. I give her likewise
four Cows and Calves and allow her to take her choice

also four sons and pigs also my Bay Mare of the name
 of Pan & a green side Saddle that is in my possession
 all these things I give and bequeath to the said Tabitha
 Balloe to have and to hold during the Continuance of her
 Natural life and no longer at her Death my wish &
 desire is that the whole of this Estate so bequeathed be
 Divided among my sister Catherine Baugh's Children
 of East Mill Near Perth North Britain, in the following
 Manner that is to say the boys (the Eldest excepted) shall
 have a third more than the girls, but the Eldest son as he
 has his father's Lands I give him no part of the above
 Estate I give and bequeath to Natural daughter Elizabeth
 Campbell alias Balloe begot on the body of the above
 Named Tabitha Balloe fourteen Negro Slaves viz
 Frasier his wife Elizabeth & their two Children Abby &
 Hercules Isaac his wife Amy & their Children, I can
 Minifred, Venus & Prince, Jack, Arquil, Sam, & Jo.
 with their future Increase Likewise give and
 bequeath unto the said Elizabeth all my Lands what-
 ever lying and being in the County of Amherst
 with all my Stock of Horses Hogs & Cattle not already
 bequeathed in this my Will also my plantation Utensils
 of all kinds I give the said Elizabeth, in Case my said
 Natural Daughter Elizabeth dies before she arrives to the
 age of eighteen Years being then unmarried it is my Will
 Desire that the Estate of Land, Slaves, Stock & hereby bequeathed
 to her shall go to my sister's Children above mentioned &
 Divided among them in the same manner the Estate
 remaining to them at the Death of the above mentioned

Tabithy Ballee is hereby directed to be divided, but should
 my Sisters eldest son not have his fathers Legner as I have
 Mentioned above then it is my desire that he shall have an
 Equal share with his brothers of their bequests, I give to John
 Rose my Brass Barrel Pistole, I give to Charles Rose my Smooth
 Gun & to Charles Irving my Rifle Gun & powder horn & Shot
 Bagg, I give to Hugh Rose my spy Glafs all the rest of my Estate
 both real and personally I give to my Natural daughter
 Elizabeth to be held by her in the same manner that I wish
 to hold the Estate together with her above & to be divided in the
 same manner among my Sisters Children should my
 Daughter die before eighteen, being unmarried, Lastly
 I appoint John Rose Charles Irving & Charles Rose Executors
 of this my last will In Witness of the above I have wrote & set my
 hand & seal this third day of December 1776

 in Court by John Rose, Charles Rose, & Charles Irving the Executors
 therein named and proved by the oaths of Edmund Wilcox &
 Laurence Campbell two subscribing Witnesses, and ordered to be
 recorded, and upon the motion of the said Executors who made
 Oath according to Law. Certificate is granted them for obtaining
 Probate thereof in due form, giving security where upon they together
 with Patrick Rose, Edmund Wilcox, Nicholas Cabell & Gabriel
 Penn their securities entered into & acknowledged their Bond in
 the penalty of six Thousand pounds with the Condition
