by me made to be null and void.

Imprimis I Bequeath my Spirit to go whithersoever it
shall please God to send it doubting not to have it again Reunited to my
Body at the Resurrection of the Just and to obtain Pardon
and the Remission of all my Sins thro the merits & Mediation
of Jesus Christ my Blessed Saviour and my Body to be
Decently Intred at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter
mentioned

Item it is my Desire that all my Worldly Estate with
which it hath pleased God to Bless me be disposed of in the
manner following

First of all I Bequeath unto my Well beloved Wife Martha
the third part of all my moveable Estate & the dwelling
House and the third of the Plantation during life that
her Decese to Return to the Rest of the Children John only
excepted— Item I Bequeath to my Son John Weir
Sixty Acres of Land lying on the Southend of my Tract
whereon I now live one new Side of bleatts and a few
that now in his Possession provided still if he should
die and all these things are to Return to the rest of
the Children

It is also my Will that my Executors shall buy for my Daughter
Elizabeth a manservant as she shall think fit
for her Use and the Use of the Plantation which she shall have

on it and at her Marriage or Departure to be valued as part
of her Patrimony it is likewise my Will that Agnes Andrew
And Thomas Martha Ann and Esther shall have their
Equal part of the inalienable Effects as they shall come to
Age. it is also my Will that ife have any of my Sons
Should chuse to learn a Trade they may be put to it at the
Age of Eighteen Years & that the Land on which I now live
may at my wife's Decease be sold and the Price of it
Equally Divided among my Children John Excepted it is
also my Will that my Son John should live with his Mother
on the Plantation and help to maintain the Children until
he shall come at the Age of Twenty one years Lastly I do
Appoint Mr Thomas Stewart & my and my brother In Law
Mr Thomas Bell as Executors of this my last Will &
Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand & Affixed my Seal this Eighteenth Day of January
in the year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred &
Seventy two.

At a Court held for Amherst County the Sixth Day of July 1772
 The last Will and Testament of Robert Warr Dec^d was presented
 in Court by Thomas one of the Executors therein named and
 proved by the Oaths of Alexander Henderson and Francis
 Turner and Credents be Accorded whereupon the said Thomas
 Bell took the Oath Required by Law and with Samuel Woods
 his Security Acknowledged Bonden the penalty of five
 hundred pounds with the Condition Required by Law -

Know all men by these presents that we Thomas Bell &
 Samuel Woods are held and firmly bound unto William Cabell jun
 James Noell Justices Thomas George Stewart & Ambrose Parker
 Gent Justices of the Court of Amherst County now sitting in the sum
 of Five hundred pounds to the payment whereof well and truly to
 be made to the said Justices and their Successors we bind ourselves
 and each of us an and each of our Heirs Executors Administrators
 jointly and severally firmly by these presents Sealed with our Seals this
 Sixth Day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand seven
 hundred and seventy two in the twelfth year of the Age of
 our Sovereign Lord George the third

The Condition of this Obligation is such that if the above
 bound Thomas Bell Executor of the last Will and Testament of
 Robert Warr Deceased do make or cause to be made a true &
 perfect Inventory of all and Singular the Goods Chattels &
 Credits of the said Deceased which have or shall come to the
 hands Possession or Knowledge of the said Thomas Bell or unto the
