In the name of God amen—
I William Hippers Being in a Low State of Health but in my Perfect Senses do make this my last Will and Testament I Surrender my Soul to God and my Body to be Buried as is usual And what small Estate it hath pleased God to bestow on me in this World I leave in manner Following First I Give to my beloved Wife one Bay Mare known by the name of Jewel one Side Saddle and Bridle one Feather Bed and Turn one Cow and Calf Two Ewes & Lambs one Loom and Gear Two Spinning Wheels and half my Pewter Darning Pleasure I likewise lend my Wife my Plantation

Houses and all my Plantation Tools I send her all my Household Furniture my Stock of Horses Cows Sheep & Hogs for the schooling and maintenance of my son John Till he arrive to the age of Eighteen years but provided she Wasts the Estate it is my Desire that it be Taken out of her Hands. I Give to my son John my Land one Feather Bed and Furniture one young Mare named Dinah one young Horse named Dreadnot one young Mare named Fancy I likewise Give him all my Stock of Cattle Sheep Hogs one Bridle & Saddle all my Household Furniture & Plantation Tools it is my Desire that my son John be for himself at the age of Eighteen years at which age he is to possess his Estate. But provided he Dies without Heir it is my Will that all my Estate return to my wife

I Give to Sarah Clarke one Cow and Calf one Eward Lamb when she arrives to the age of Eighteen

It is my Will and Desire that David Crawford and Abraham Penn be my Executors Sealed with my Seal and Dated this Twenty Second Day of April Anno. Domini 1769 Sealed signed and Delivered

 This last Will & Testament of William Shippers Deceased was presented in Court by Abraham Penn one of the Executors

therein named (David Crawford the other Executor
 appeared in Court & Refused to take upon himself the
 Execution thereof and proved by the Oaths of William
 Peter and John Hegg two of the witnesses thereto and
 Ordered to be Recorded. and on the motion of the said Abraham
 Penn who made Oath according to Law probate is granted
 him and with Edmund Wilcox & William Horsey his
 Securities entered into & acknowledged Bond in the
 penalty of one hundred pounds with the Condition Required
 by Law

 Lord one Thousand seven hundred and Sixty nine & in
 the Tenth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George
 the Third

 Testament Wm: Heppers Deceased do make or cause to be
 made a true & perfect Inventory of all and singular
